PRESENTER BIOGRAPHY

Donna Facer, woman-entrepreneur, began her career in digital publishing with start-up businesses including WebPort Inc., a website design studio serving large corporations in 1996, at the beginning of the Internet age. She was vice president and website coder. In that capacity, Donna successfully delivered over 100 websites that brought e-commerce to the Internet. Then, in 2002, at Turnleaf Solutions, an educational data reporting company, she was the lead user experience designer, creating innovative data reporting solutions that led to the company purchase by CTB McGraw-Hill in 2005.

She went on to serve for over 20 years in digital publishing for education companies such as Pearson Higher Education, National Geographic Learning, and CTB McGraw-Hill as product designer, project manager, and consultant. At McGraw-Hill, Ms. Facer launched online reporting products for TABE, Las Links ™, and TerraNova ® assessment systems.

Donna has received recognition for her work and won awards, such as

the Women in Technology Award, and the Pearson Higher Education Excellence in Achievement Award, a peer-nominated award, given to one employee quarterly. With her extensive knowledge and experience in computer and instructional technology, she developed a vision for the future of education with virtual reality. She founded New World VR Corporation in 2019 and opened two location-based virtual reality arcades in Williamsburg and Norfolk, Virginia. These locations serve as an avenue for the development of virtual reality technology, application development, and an educational resource for local schools and homeschoolers.

Additionally, Donna has made many positive contributions to her community. She has worked with <u>www.K4RC.org</u> Amateur Radio Club as an Emergency Communications Provider. She has also worked with a non-profit family shelter in New Jersey, providing IT support.

Donna received her bachelor's degree in physics with a Programming emphasis for the University of Colorado at Boulder.





















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
